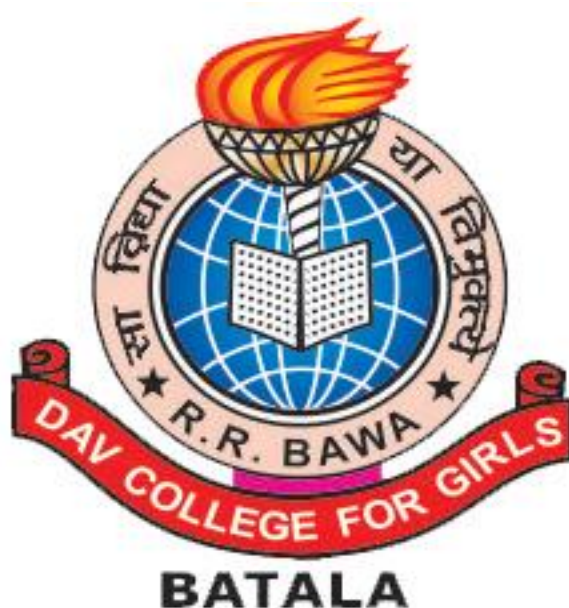

- The performance of the non-teaching staff is appraised by the college based on the reports of the Supervising Officers and finally assessed by the Principal.
- The performance of the Library Staff is evaluated by the Librarian.
- The working of the Lab Attendant is regularly monitored by the respective HODs.
- Separate meetings of temporary/adhoc/contractual staff along with their HODs are held to assess, improve & appreciate their working.
